### Refunds

To drop a course please contact the Program Office by phone at **1.800.565.4371** or by email to [distance.nursing@stfx.ca](mailto:distance.nursing@stfx.ca) (we don't have a drop option on Banner). **Please do not contact the Registrar's Office.**

If a student withdraws from a course within three weeks of the course start date, s/he is eligible to claim a tuition refund, less a \$150 processing charge. After the three-week deadline has passed, there is no refund issued. Your application for a refund must be made in writing via email to the Program Office within the three-week period. Please include your StFX ID# and the name and number of the course.

**Contacting your professor does not constitute formal withdrawal from a course** and will not be considered in the calculation of a refund – you must follow the steps above.

## DISTANCE NURSING FALL/WINTER SCHEDULE

COURSE	DATES	DESCRIPTION
<b>BIOL 115.77</b> <b>Microbes in Human Health</b>  <b>CRN 54979</b> <b>Lab CRN 54980</b>  <b>V. Karunakaran</b>	<b>January 6 - March 20, 2020</b>  <b>Online</b>	An introduction to microorganisms from a human perspective, this course deals with viruses, bacteria and fungi. Topics include bacterial structure and function, bacterial genetics and antibiotic resistance, and viral structure and infection. Restricted to nursing students. <b>Prerequisites: BIOL 105</b> , completed or concurrent. Three credits.
<b>BIOL 252.77</b> <b>Human Anatomy and Physiology II</b>  <b>CRN 54981</b> <b>Lab CRN 54982</b>  <b>V. Karunakaran</b>	<b>January 6 - March 20, 2020</b>  <b>Online</b>	As an integrated study of the cardiovascular, respiratory, urinary, reproductive, and digestive systems, this course provides students with a comprehensive working knowledge of the anatomy and physiology of these systems. Three credits. <b>Prerequisite: BIOL 251.</b>
<b>NURS 115.77</b> <b>Health Teaching and Learning</b>  <b>CRN 54954</b>  <b>D. Vandewater</b>	<b>November 11, 2019 - January 24, 2020</b>  <b>Online</b>	In contrast to health protection and illness prevention, health promotion is a broad and holistic concept. This course explores the concept of health promotion; the nurse's role in health promotion; the teaching-learning process; population health; social action and justice; and the socio-cultural, economic, and political factors that influence health and health behaviour. Three credits.
<b>NURS 205.77</b> <b>Community Health Nursing</b>  <b>CRN 54967</b>  <b>M. MacLellan</b>	<b>January 27 - April 3, 2020</b>  <b>Online</b>	This course explores the role of the community health nurse in the context of a changing health care system. Topics include population health, primary health care, community assessment, epidemiology and demography, environment and ecology, cultural competence, ethics, and community-as-partner. Three credits.
<b>NURS 237.77</b> <b>Nursing Concepts in the Care of Women, Children and Families</b>  <b>CRN 54976</b>  <b>D. Sheppard-Lemoine</b>	<b>January 27 - April 3, 2020</b>  <b>Online</b>  <div style="background-color: #FFD700; padding: 5px; text-align: center;"><b>COURSE IS FULL</b></div>	This course encompasses a contemporary overview of the health of women, children and families during the childbearing and childrearing years from a wellness-focused nursing perspective. Selected topics and issues related to health promotion and illness prevention within this population will be explored in the context of the various social, political, cultural and economic factor which impact the health and wellness of women, children and families. A strengths-based, women and family-centred care approach will be used in exploring these concepts. Prerequisites: NURS 115, 135. Three credits.

COURSE	DATES	DESCRIPTION
<b>NURS 300.77</b> <b>Research Methods</b>  CRN 54961 Lab CRN 54962  A. Gillis	<b>November 11, 2019 -</b> <b>April 3, 2020</b>  Online  <b>COURSE IS FULL</b>	This course introduces students to research methods used in nursing science. Topics include conducting and appraising research; concepts of research design, implementation, analysis, and interpretation; descriptive and inferential statistics; quantitative and qualitative research design; and research ethics and biases. Six credits.
<b>NURS 330.77</b> <b>Legal and Ethical Issues in</b> <b>Nursing</b>  CRN 54963  A. Belardo	<b>November 11, 2019 -</b> <b>April 3, 2020</b>  Online  <b>COURSE IS FULL</b>	This course examines the moral and ethical implications of various practices in the field of health care as they affect human life and the basic dignity of the person. This course also explores the moral, ethical, legal, and theological issues raised by recent developments in the life sciences. Cross-listed as RELS 300. Six credits.
<b>NURS 425.77</b> <b>Comprehensive Health</b> <b>Assessment</b>  CRN 54974  M. MacNeil	<b>January 27 - April 3, 2020</b>  Online	This theory and practice course focuses on a systematic assessment of the well adult. Students will incorporate health history and physical examination of body systems in identifying self-care requisites for a diverse population. Three credits.
<b>NURS 483.77</b> <b>Hospice Palliative Care</b> <b>Nursing</b>  CRN 54983  D. Vandewater	<b>January 6 - March 20, 2020</b>  Online	This course provides an overview of theories, current practices, and relevant issues in the field of palliative care, with a focus on the nurse's role. In line with the philosophy of nursing at StFX, students will explore concepts of self-care and health promotion as they relate to quality of life issues. Three credits.
<b>NURS 494.77</b> <b>Leadership and</b> <b>Management in Nursing</b>  CRN 54958  A. Gillis	<b>November 11, 2019 -</b> <b>January 24, 2020</b>  Online	This course is an examination of nursing leadership theories and management models and their relationship to client care. The course explores the changing roles and expectations for registered nurses as leaders in the health care system. Three credits.

**\*\*Please Note:** Although there are no lab components with any distance nursing courses, some courses require students to enter a **CRN** for the course as well as a **CRN** for the lab. These courses are Biology 252, and Biology 115.

The Registration Deadline is **November 26<sup>th</sup>, 2019** for courses starting in January 2020. Please select "**Full academic year 2019-2020**" when registering for these courses.

## PROCTOR FORMS

### Proctors

Students are required to obtain a qualified proctor to supervise the writing of their exams. A proctor must be in an administrative position and affiliated with an institution or organization (i.e., college, university, hospital or other health care organization). Students often approach their supervisor or unit manager at their place of employment. While not always possible, it is recommended that the student choose a person who is willing to assume this responsibility for the duration of the program of study.

Guidelines for Proctors and the Proctor Information are downloadable from Moodle. Please ensure that the forms are filled out legibly by your proctor. It is the responsibility of the student to ensure this information is completed by their prospective proctor and forwarded to the Program Office **in the first two weeks** of starting their program of study. Any change in proctor information during the course of study must be clearly communicated in writing to the Program Office no less than two weeks prior to the examination date. **Students who fail to submit this information to Program Office will not receive an examination.**

**\*\*Proctor policies will be changing in January 2020. Proctors must be affiliated with a POST-SECONDARY INSTITUTION or TESTING CENTRE.\*\***
