### Step 1:


- Review the list of articles your professor has provided.
- Highlight the title of each article.
- In this example, the name of the article is: **“Use of formative research to develop a yoga curriculum for high-risk youth: Implementation considerations”**

- Go to the Library website: <http://sites.stfx.ca/library/>
- From the main search box, enter the title of the article, and select the search button

**TIP:** Putting **quotation marks** around your search term will provide more precise results
